

**Iris G Udasin M.D**

Iris G Udasin M.D. is the Director of the Rutgers University WTC CCE, serves as Medical Director of the clinic of Environmental and Occupational Health Science Institute (EOHSI), and is a professor of environmental and occupational medicine.

She graduated from SUNY – Downstate Medical Center and completed residency in internal medicine and training in occupational medicine at Rutgers University. She is board certified in internal medicine and occupational medicine.

She is a principal investigator and has been directly involved in providing care to those suffering from adverse health effects of the World Trade Center (WTC) exposures from the onset of the WTC program. In January 2003, she began seeing WTC patients at the EOHSI clinic. Her earlier work involved exposures to chromium and mercury in New Jersey. She developed and implemented plans for employee health for all of the health science campuses of Rutgers University and has directed employee health for central New Jersey campuses and published several papers concerning exposures in health care workers.

As a member of the WTC steering committee, she continues to work collaboratively with other WTC treatment centers to monitor and treat patients exposed to toxins. Along with other investigators, she has worked to establish the relationship between WTC exposure and sleep apnea. She has also noted an increase in head and neck cancers in WTC patients. In addition to patient care, she has worked to improve the pension system for New Jersey police and firefighters exposed to WTC toxin.

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**Jodi Streich, Ph.D.**

Dr. Streich serves as the Director of Mental Health at Rutgers University World Trade Center Health Program Clinical Center of Excellence. She is responsible for the development and implementation of mental health services for the World Trade Center first responders. Dr. Streich also serves as the Training Director for pre-doctoral and post-doctoral clinical psychology programs.

Dr. Streich has worked in many therapeutic settings including hospitals, outpatient rehabilitation facilities, and universities. Dr. Streich earned her M.A. degrees and Ph.D. degree in Clinical Psychology from Adelphi University, Derner Institute of Advanced Psychological Studies. She completed her doctoral training in Clinical and Neuropsychology at the Rusk Institute of Rehabilitation Medicine, New York University Medical Center in NYC. Subsequent to her clinical residency, Dr. Streich completed a postdoctoral fellowship in Clinical Neuropsychology. During her doctoral training, Dr. Streich was appointed the position of World Trade Center Coordinator after September 11th. Her dissertation was on the effects of exposure to the 9/11 attacks within the NYC corporate population. Recent research has included identifying the elements of exposure and mental health conditions among World Trade Center Law Enforcement Responders.

Her passion and clinical focus have always been in trauma and healing. One of her greatest pleasures is proudly serving Veterans who have suffered from posttraumatic stress disorder, psychiatric and mood disorders, and traumatic brain injuries. Dr. Streich is dedicated to removing the stigma of mental health and normalizing the impact of traumatic events in survivors. Dr. Streich is licensed in the states of New Jersey and New York.

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**Joseph M. Morris Jr.**

Joseph M. Morris Jr. is the Retired Port Authority of NY & NJ Chief of the Department.

On May 8, 1972, he was appointed to the Port Authority Police Department. He served over 31 years with the Department; rose through the ranks involved with and directed police and public safety operations at the New York/New Jersey Metropolitan Region airports, ports, tunnels, bridges, trains, terminals, and communications facilities.

On September 11, 2001, as Commanding Officer LaGuardia Airport responded to and took part in the rescue and recovery operation following the WTC Attacks and collapse. Later that day he was designated the Site Commander leading Port Authority Rescue and Recovery Operations.

On September 26, 2001 he was promoted to Chief of Department/Acting Director Public Safety Superintendent of Police.

Chief Morris is a 1970 Graduate of Upsala College, attended Police Command College at West Point Military Academy in 1990, and attended FBI National Executive Institute in 2002. During his career, he was awarded numerous Port Authority Police Medals and Commendations as well as Tributes from the United States House of Representatives, and the Governors of New York and New Jersey.

In January 2004, he retired from the Port Authority of NY & NJ Police Department, joining ManTech International, then URS Corporation providing construction management services for the Port Authority at the World Trade Center Transportation Hub/Site. In August 2007, he accepted federal appointment to Federal Security Director position at John F. Kennedy International Airport with the Transportation Security Administration.

In May 2009, he resigned from the TSA position and retired. In November 2017, he accepted a part-time Senior Security Analyst position with the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey.

In 2008, Frederick Suydam Memorial Association, a diverse group of law enforcement, intelligence, and corporate security persons, recognized Chief Morris' dedicated service "marked by the personal attributes of fidelity, bravery, integrity, devotion to duty and whole-hearted spirit of cooperation with all law enforcement agencies".

Chief Morris has been married 45 years to Linda, with two married sons Joseph (Bridget) & Andrew (Alissa), five grandsons, and finally one granddaughter.

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### **Dr. Michael Libertazzo**

Dr. Michael Libertazzo is a psychologist psychoanalyst. A graduate of Livingston College and Rutgers' Graduate School of Education, he has worked with private organizations, colleges, universities, and federal, state and local law enforcement agencies. He also has served on Disaster Medical Assistance Teams with The United States Department of Public Health and FEMA. He is a founding member of Homeland Security. Currently, he continues seeing psychotherapy patients in his private practice in Princeton and is employed by Penn Medicine at Princeton Hospital.

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### **Chief Timothy Griffin**

Chief Timothy Griffin's career spans 40 years. He has served in three different law enforcement agencies on the county, municipal, and college and university policing levels. He first served with the Hudson County Prosecutor's Office attaining the rank of Captain of Detectives, then went on to serve as the Police Director of the West New York Police Department. He now serves as the Chief of Police for the Stevens Institute of Technology Campus Police Department for the past 15 years. Chief Griffin holds a bachelor's

degree in Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness and is a volunteer bugler with Bugles Across America, an organization that works alongside every branch of the military and ensures that every veteran receives Full Military Honors at the time of their death with a live bugler performing TAPS. He has performed TAPS several hundred times at both military and police veterans' burial services.

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### **Edward T. Cetnar**

Edward T. Cetnar was appointed Superintendent of Police and Director of Public Safety of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey Police Department on May 11, 2018. Mr. Cetnar oversees the daily operation of the over 2300 person Police Department. He is responsible for the police and security services of the New York Metro area's airports, including John F. Kennedy International, Newark Liberty International and LaGuardia Airport. Additionally, Mr. Cetnar is responsible for the Path Train System, Port Authority Bus Terminal, Lincoln and Holland Tunnels, Port Newark, Brooklyn Piers, George Washington Bridge, Staten Island Bridge Crossings, as well as the World Trade Center Complex.

Prior to his appointment to the Port Authority, Mr. Cetnar served over 27 years with the New Jersey State Police. At the end of his service, Mr. Cetnar served as a Lt. Colonel serving as the Deputy Superintendent of Operations. During his tenure, Lt. Colonel Cetnar was tapped as the Incident Commander for the 2013 and 2014 Miss America Pageants, the 2014 National Special Olympics, and most notably the 2014 NFL Super Bowl. Further, in 2012, Lt. Colonel Cetnar was the Incident Commander for the Agudath Israel Event. Held at Met Life Stadium, 90,000 from the community gathered to celebrate the Siyum Hashas. This gathering is considered the largest in the history of the Jewish faith. The event earned worldwide acclaim for its security and protective measures taken to protect a faith-based celebration. Lt. Colonel Cetnar was the Statewide Incident Commander for the search, rescue, and security operations caused by Hurricane Sandy in 2012.

Mr. Cetnar holds a Master's Degree from Seton Hall University where he currently serves as an Adjunct Professor. He is a graduate from the FBI National Academy and the United States Army's Commandant's 7th Strategic Studies Program

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### **Reverend Joanne Petto**

Reverend Joanne Petto has been a Law Enforcement Chaplain for more than 20 years, serving with the Plainsboro Township Police Department and the New Jersey State Police. She is a Life Member of the International Conference of Police Chaplains, a Board-Certified Expert in Traumatic Stress, a Disaster Response Crisis Counselor and Chaplain, and a member of the Crisis Intervention Response Network. As a WTC First Responder, Reverend Petto served 1-2 12-hour shifts per week at Ground Zero through November 30, 2001.

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### **Chief Christopher Trucillo**

Christopher Trucillo is the Senior Vice President, Chief of Police & Office of Emergency Management for NJ TRANSIT. NJ TRANSIT is the third largest transportation agency in the nation. The NJ TRANSIT Police Department is also the only statewide transit police agency in the nation.

Chief Trucillo is responsible for the overall direction and oversight of all police operations and coordinating emergency management activities within all departments and business lines within NJ TRANSIT. Since joining NJ TRANSIT, the Chief has led the emergency response and planning for NJ

TRANSIT for Super Storm Sandy, Super Bowl XLVIII, Papal Visit of Pope Francis and currently the COVID-19 Pandemic. In September 2020, he was appointed by TSA Administrator Pekoske to serve as a voting member on the Surface Transportation Security Advisory Committee (STSAC). Chief Trucillo is also Chairman of the TSA Transit Policing and Security Peer Advisory Group.

Chief Trucillo's law enforcement career encompasses over 38 years of experience. Prior to joining NJ TRANSIT, Chief Trucillo served 23 years with the Port Authority Police Department of NY/NJ. During his PAPD career, the Chief worked in all business areas of the Port Authority, to include Aviation, Commuter Rail, Ports and Surface Transportation facilities. Chief Trucillo also served as the Chief of Department for the Port Authority Police Department during a difficult time in its history post 9/11. Prior to joining NJ TRANSIT, Chief Trucillo also served as the Director of Public Safety for John Jay College in New York City.

Chief Trucillo has an undergraduate degree in Economics from Rutgers University and also holds a Master's degree in Criminal Justice from Rutgers University School of Criminal Justice. Chief Trucillo is a graduate of the FBI National Academy 201st Session and the FBI National Executive Institute 29th Session. Chief Trucillo has also completed the Eno Center for Transportation Transit Senior Executive Program in Washington, DC.
